


The Good News from Trinity PC

Trinity Worship Services for May and June 2020

The Trinity session had a virtual meeting on Sunday, May 3 to discuss plans for Trinity worship services for the rest of May and into early June. In accordance with the continuing Ohio restriction on group gathering size of 10 people and the recommendation of the Presbytery of Cincinnati, the session reached consensus that we would continue to have virtual pre-recorded worship services through Sunday, May 24. These recorded services will be equivalent to those offered recently, basically a full worship services including musical accompaniment. Bulletins are emailed on Thursday to follow along.

The session's intent is to begin in-person Trinity worship services at the church building on Sunday, May 31, a day on which we will have a belated Easter celebration service.

On the following Sunday, June 7 we will celebrate Pentecost.



Over the next two weeks a committee of session members will finalize the plans for reopening the Trinity building for worship. A letter will be mailed to the congregation during the week of May 18, that will describe what actions will be taken to prepare the building for onsite worship, what to expect in terms of the configuration of the sanctuary and worship format, and what other actions we will perform to protect the health of our congregants.

Session understands that not everyone will be comfortable returning to the building for worship at the end of May. Therefore, we plan to continue to offer recordings of the worship service on May 31 and subsequent Sundays. By May 31 we also anticipate that Trinity will have the technical capability to provide a video recording of the worship service, that can be live streamed at 10:15 AM or played later at your convenience.

Prepare for Worship 6th Sunday of Easter

Psalm 66:8-20

"Bless our God, O peoples,
let the sound of his praise be heard,
who has kept us among the living,
and has not let our feet slip.
For you, O God, have tested us;
you have tried us as silver is tried.
You brought us into the net;
you laid burdens on our backs;
you let people ride over our heads;

Where have you felt such a spacious place? What story do you tell of the ways that God is blessing you? What story does your faith community tell of the ways in which God is blessing them?

A DEVOTION

Scripture Reading: Psalm 138

Only in the darkness can you see the stars. —Martin Luther King Jr.

They still tell the story at William and Mary College of daffy, magnificent President Ewell. For a century and a half, this prestigious Virginia school had been a leader among American universities. Then came the Civil War. In the hard days of reconstruction that followed, William and Mary went bankrupt. Soon it had a deserted campus, decaying buildings and no students.



As with so many Southern schools after that tragic war, everyone wrote it off as dead. Everyone, except its president. He had given his best years to advancing the liberal arts through that school. He refused to give up now. So, every morning, President Ewell went to the deserted campus, climbed the tower of its main building, and rang the bells, calling the school to class.

He behaved as though the school was still there.

People thought he was crazy. Nevertheless, every day for seven years, President Ewell rang the bells at William and Mary, in defiance of the despair and hopelessness that would destroy everything he held valuable.

Eventually and miraculously, it worked. Others caught his vision. Students, teachers and money returned. Today, America's second oldest university thrives again, because of the hope of a single man.

Today, people suffer all around the world. Churches are shuttered by the threat of disease and uncertainty and scattered by the fear of disease and uncertainty.

Many people are shut up in their homes or apartments having no else to go: no work, no restaurants nor entertainment venues. It's such a different atmosphere from the bustle and high-energy life we're used to.

But we persist, wherever we are.

We worship God in our homes and online with a virtual community of believers. We read the Bible. We pray on bended knee. We give thanks. We help others in their time of need. We walk humbly with God. We're ringing the bells of hope.






