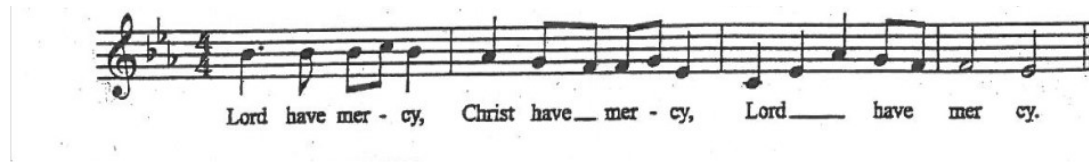
PRAYER OF CONFESSION
